


BACKGROUND:

Issues brought up in the previous Council Communication and the Community Forum that the City Manager's office is requested to follow up on are listed below.

- a. **Parking next door to Police Department during meetings-** The City Manager has sent a letter to Dr. Guidry asking for a meeting to further discuss the closing of the parking area adjacent to the City Council Chambers. Dr. Guidry has expressed his intent to permanently block the parking area from overflow parking. Staff will keep the Council apprised of the status of communications with Dr. Guidry.
- b. **Resolution SB 1634-** The City of Sanibel Island is requesting that local governments consider passing a resolution in support of Senate Bill 1634. This bill would require the Department of Environmental Protection to notify each county and city within a 5 mile radius in writing within 5 days of discovering a wastewater facility violation. The bill would also require the Wastewater Compliance Evaluation Section of the Department of Environmental Protection to identify the source of the sewage contaminants when Florida's beaches are closed as a result of Health Department bacteriological water sampling. Mr. Olmsted has prepared a draft resolution for City Council's consideration. ***The bill has been approved through the Health Regulation and Environmental Preservation and Conservation Committees. It is been placed in the General Government Appropriations. This has no financial impact on municipal governments.***
- c. **Sewer Construction Open House-** On April 29, 2008, the City Public Works and Finance Departments hosted an open house in the Community Room. The event offered residents in the Lamplighter and Sheffield Districts answers to questions and information important for them before, during and after the construction. The meeting was attended by Councilor Jerry Gibson along with about one hundred residents.
- d. **City Comprehensive Plan Amendments-** The Florida Department of Community Affairs has provided a letter of intent to find the City of Marco Island's Comprehensive Plan Amendments, adopted by Ordinance 08-03 in compliance with the requirements of State rule.
