

## **CAUTION**

A Contractor is defined in the statute as a person who is <u>qualified</u> for, and is only responsible for, the project contracted for and means, except as exempted in this part, the person who, for compensation, undertakes to, submits a bid to, or does himself or herself or by others construct, repair, alter, remodel, add to, demolish, subtract from, or improve any building or structure, including related improvements to real estate, for others or for resale to others(...) – F.S.S.489.105



Unlicensed contracting can and does lead to arrest after no less than \$3,000.00 in fines.



ANY REQUEST MADE FOR FUNDS UP FRONT.

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YOU ARE ASKED TO OBTAIN THE PERMIT YOURSELF.
If an owner obtains their own permits, they are
responsible for the entire permitting process...
Including acquiring a Certificate of Occupancy.

BUSINESS CARD HAS NO LICENSE NUMBER.
Licensed Contractors are required by law to
include their license number on ALL advertising.



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VERBAL CONTRACT.
The contractor is unwilling to put the agreement on paper, making the exchange unenforceable.

THE CONTRACTOR
PROVIDED A LICENSE
BUT YOU'RE NOT
SURE IT'S VALID.

An occupational license or tax receipt does NOT qualify an individual to act as a contractor.

The contractor informs you the project does not require a permit. This could lead homeowners to hefty fines and a meeting with the magistrate. Call Building Services and speak with an inspector to find out the facts.



Knowingly hiring an unlicensed contractor can result in up to \$5000.00 in punitive damages to the homeowner
