EMERGENCY/EXECUTIVE ORDER 20-05

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA, REGARDING CERTAIN PROTOCOLS WITH RESPECT TO BEACHES AND PARKING DURING COVID-19 STATE OF EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND TEMPORARY INCREASE IN PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2020, Governor Desantis announced Phase Three of the State's Reopening Plan which includes suspending all fines and penalties issued as part of the pandemic response.

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes Sec. 252.46 provides in relevant part that "In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 120, the political subdivisions of the state...are authorized and empowered to make, amend, and rescind such orders and rules as are necessary for emergency management purposes..." so long as such powers are not in conflict with the State; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED BY THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Enforcement of all City codes related to parking, beach conduct and vessel regulation are still in effect and will be enforced with penalties defined within the code.
- 2. The City of Marco Island will continue to enforce social distancing on public beaches.
- 3. The Emergency Order 20-04 and subsequent Emergency Orders shall be terminated effective immediately in accordance with the State's Phase Three Reopening Plan.
