



PROCLAMATION

TO AMEND THE DECLARED STATE OF EMERGENCY WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, Chapter 10 of the City Code establishes the procedures for civil emergencies; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Ron Desantis issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring that a state of emergency exists in the State of Florida due to the public health threat posed by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Collier County Board of Commissioners has declared a state of emergency due to the public health threat posed by COVID-19 and it is prudent and necessary to take action to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community in the event of a state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2020, the City of Marco Island initiated COVID-19 emergency protective measures; and

WHEREAS, the Chair of City Council is empowered to declare or amend a local state of emergency whenever he shall determine that a natural or manmade disaster has occurred or that the occurrence or threat of one is imminent and requires immediate and expeditious action.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it declared by the Chair of the City Council of Marco Island, Florida, this 5th day of May 2021 that:

1. A state of emergency was declared on March 16, 2020, and reinstated on November 9, 2020, and is now amended by this revised Declaration of Emergency order on May 5, 2021. This Declaration of Emergency shall continue the Disaster Emergency Plans applicable to the City and shall be the authority for the use or distribution of any supplies, equipment, materials and/or facilities assembled or arranged to be made available pursuant to such Plans or as otherwise warranted to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents and public within the City.
2. This Declaration of Emergency explicitly does not authorize any restrictions or mandates upon individuals or businesses by the City; therefore, Sec. 10-6 of the City Code of Ordinances does not apply to this Declaration of Emergency.
3. This Declaration of Emergency will expire on June 26, 2021, in conjunction with the Governor's Executive Order 20-52, as further extended pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order 21-94, unless further extended by the Governor.
