## RESOLUTION NO. 00-44

## A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AND ENFORCE SPECIFIC POLICIES REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) FOR COMMUNITIES PARTICIPATING IN URBAN COUNTY COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, makes provisions whereby counties may enter into cooperative agreements with certain units of government to carry out activities which will be funded from annual HUD Community Development Block Grant Entitlement and HOME program funds; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires participating communities to adopt and enforce specific policies as part of Urban County Cooperative Agreements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Marco Island wants to participate in Collier County's Urban County CDBG and HOME programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Marco Island, Collier County, Florida:

Section 1: That the City of Marco Island hereby adopts the following policies as required by HUD:

- 1. The City of Marco Island prohibits the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations.
- 2. The City of Marco Island will enforce applicable State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within its jurisdiction.
- Section 2: That the above policies shall be incorporated into appropriate departmental operating policies and procedures.

Section 3: That the City of Marco Island will enforce these policies upon approval by City Council.
