14	WITTER AS in 2006 the City Council adouted Ordinance 06.05 pedified as
15 16	WHEREAS, in 2006, the City Council adopted Ordinance 06-05, codified as Chapter 54, Article VI, entitled "Waterways and Boating Safety", to establish regulation
17	of the use and operation of vessels on the public waters of the City; and
18	of the use and operation of vessels on the public waters of the City, and
19	WHEREAS, since that time it has become necessary to make certain changes to
20	Chapter 54, Article VI, to more clearly reflect regulations that are consistent with Federal
21	and State laws; and
22	WHEREAS, after having received input from and participation by interested
23	members of the public and staff, the City Council finds the proposed amendments to its
24	Code of Ordinances are in the best interest of the City, the residents of Marco Island and
25	its visitors; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, City Council has conducted a first and second reading of this
28	Ordinance at duly noticed public hearings as required by law.
29 30	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
31	THE CITY OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA:
32	THE CITT OF MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA.
33	SECTION 1. Recitals. The foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are
34	hereby ratified and confirmed as being true, correct and reflective of the legislative intent
35	underlying this Ordinance and are hereby made a specific part of this Ordinance.
36 37	SECTION 2. Amendment and Adoption.
38 39 40 41	The following sections of Chapter 54, Article VI, of the City of Marco Island Code of Ordinances are hereby amended or created and adopted as follows:

42 43	1. Section 54-164, entitled "Definitions" are hereby amended as follows:
44	Not engaged in the exercise of rights of navigation means a vessel anchored within the City
45	for more than 72 consecutive hours.
46 47	2. Section 54-166, entitled "Interference With Navigation", is hereby amended as
48 49	follows:
50 51	Sec. 54-166. Interference with navigation.
52	Consistent with Section 327.44, Florida Statutes, as may be subsequently modified or
53	amended from time to time, no person shall anchor, operate, or permit to be anchored,
54	except in case of emergency, or operated a vessel or carry on any prohibited activity in a
55	manner which shall unreasonably or unnecessarily constitute a navigational hazard or
56	interfere with another vessel. Anchoring under bridges or in or adjacent to heavily
57	traveled channels shall constitute interference if unreasonable under the prevailing
58	circumstances.
59	No person shall operate, or permit anyone to operate, a vessel, anchor a vessel, or drift in
60	a vessel, in a manner that interferes with navigation, except in case of emergency.
61	
62	3. Section 54-167, entitled "Anchoring and mooring" is hereby amended as
63	follows:

65	Sec. 54-167. Anchoring and mooring.

67	It shall be unlawful:
68	(1) To analyze the state of the
69 70	(1) To anchor or moor a live-aboard vessel or floating structure within the city. A "floating structure" shall have the same meaning as used in Section 327.02, Florida
70 71	Statutes, as may be subsequently modified or amended from time to time.
72	
73	(2) To anchor or moor under or within 300 feet of the County Road 92 or State Road
74	951 bridges at the Marco River.
75	C
76	(3) (2) To moor a vessel at a dock, mooring, piling or seawall of a property owner
77	without the consent of the owner or person in control of the premises, except in an
78	emergency. Failure to provide written evidence of such permission shall be considered as
79	prima fascia evidence of lack of permission. Any such mooring must comply with all
80	applicable regulations of the city Code.
81	
82	(4) To anchor or moor a commercial vessel for a time period greater than 12 consecutive
83	hours, except:
84	
85	a. When engaged in a commercial activity permitted by the city.

(8) To anchor a vessel during a hurricane warning by utilizing an anchor or series of anchors, without being affixed to a dock or seawall. During a hurricane warning each

vessel operator shall secure their vessel to prevent the vessel, and/or its parts or contents

from damaging the property of others.

130	(9) To anchor vessels without adequate ground tackle to hold the vessel at anchor.
131	Vessels at anchor shall maintain a firm anchor and the operator shall-insure that the
132	vessel is not slipping anchor and changing its location.
133	
134	(10) To leave any anchored vessel unattended without the following information posted
135	securely on deck in a weather proof housing or format such as laminated paper:
136	
137	a. Vessel owner's name, address (local and other, if applicable) and phone number(s);
138	
139	b. A secondary contact person with his or her name, address (local and other if
140	applicable) and phone number(s). Secondary contacts shall live or work within Collier,
141	Lee, or Dade Counties and be authorized to act in the owner's behalf should the vessel
142	become endangered.

144	(11) To anchor any recreational vessel not engaged in the exercise of the rights of
145	navigation except:
146	navigation except.
147	a. When proof of marine sanitation device holding tank pump out, or other satisfactory
148	evidence of sufficient holding tank capacity, is provided to a City of Marco Island Police
149	Officer and a permit is issued allowing an additional 72-hour anchoring period.

150	b. When we and at a commencial massing leverfully permitted purguent to the gamine
151	b. When moored at a commercial marina lawfully permitted pursuant to the zoning
152	code.

154	e. When anchored within the special anchorage in factory bay designated on NOAA
155	chart 11430.
156	
157	d. When the vessel is in need of emergency repairs, for a reasonable period to complete
158	the repairs, which shall not exceed seven days.
159	
160	e. To provide safe harbor during inclement weather.
161	
162	f. During a verifiable emergency for a reasonable period which shall not exceed seven
163	days.
164	
165	(12) Once a vessel is anchored within the city, the vessel shall be deemed to have been
166	continuously anchored from the time at which it was first anchored. The vessel need not
167	have been continuously anchored in the same location within the city limits. It is the
168	express purpose of this article to prohibit evasion of the time limitations contained in this
169	article by relocation from one anchoring location within the city to another.
170	
171	(13) To anchor or moor any recreational vessel closer than 300 feet to any seawall,

bridge, dock, shoreline, or manmade structure for a time period greater than 12

consecutive hours, except:

a. At a dock, mooring, piling or seawall of a property owner with the consent of the
owner or person in control of the premises. Failure to provide written evidence of such
permission shall be considered as prima facia evidence of lack of permission. Any such
dockage or mooring must comply with all applicable regulations of the city Code
including those detailed in article IV of this chapter.
•
b. When actively engaged in recreational fishing and not interfering with navigation.
c. When anchored or moored within the special anchorage in factory bay designated on
NOAA chart 11430.
d. The intent of this section is to maintain a channel for safe navigation, to reduce visual
intrusion, and to prevent noise complaints.
SECTION 3. Inclusion in the Code of Ordinances.
It is the intention of the City Council and it is hereby ordained that the
amendments to the City of Marco Island Code of Ordinances made by this Ordinance
shall become part of the City of Marco Island Code of Ordinances, that the sections of
this Ordinance may be renumbered and relettered as necessary, and that the word
"Ordinance" may be changed to "Section, "Article" or other appropriate word.
SECTION 4. Conflicts.
All ordinances or parts of ordinances and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in
conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
SECTION 5. Severability.
If any section, clause, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held
invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the holding shall not
