- On July 2nd, Officer Bill Miller was the first to roll out our new Polaris.
- Young Mackle Park Campers received an education from both PD and Fire on July 3rd.
- Marco Island deployed additional personnel July 4th, to patrol the beach and the entire island.
 Community Service Officers assisted with traffic control and pedestrian crosswalks. Additional Marine Patrols were out covering 4th of July activities.
- Congratulations to Officer Zachery Kirsch, who was promoted to Sergeant July 5th.
- Hurricane Beryl, although small, made itself known Saturday July 7th, reminding us all to get prepared for hurricane season.
- School Resource Officer, Sergeant Mark Haueter attended a D.A.R.E. Convention the week of July 9th, preparing for the fast approaching school season.
- MIPD Participated in Camp Able July 14th where children with special needs are taught crafts and have summer fun.
- The week of July 16th City staff from multiple departments met with the City Attorney to discuss new ordinances.
- Also, July 16th, Officers Josh Ferris, Bob Marvin, and Clayton Smith received Proclamations from Marco Island City Council for Josh's paddle board crossing from the Bahamas to Florida.
- Bike Safety Class was held for kids at Mackle Park on July 26th.

- 3. **Criminal Justice information System (CJIS)** -Mandatory tri-annual training completed by several officers.
- 4. Roll Call Use of Force Training reviewed by all shifts
- 5. **CIT (Crisis Intervention Team**)- is a mandatory certification attended by Officers Mark Huffor and Allan Reyes.
- 6. **FEMA Training** several officers taking Incident command training classes to meet FEMA requirements.
- 7. **Rescue Swimmer levels I & II** Twenty-nine (29) officers participated and were certified as Rescue Swimmers levels I & II.
- 8. Marine Officer Josh Ferris was certified as a **Rescue Swimmer instructor**.


