## Significant Events

- May 1 Chief Schettino attended the Marco Island 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner held at the Marco Island Marriott.
- May 11 Chief Schettino attended the Law Enforcement Memorial Ceremony at United Methodist Church in Naples.
- May 12 First Magistrate Hearing.
- May 16 Chief Schettino, along with several members of MIPD, attended the Life Jacket World Record Day event at Rose Marina.
- May 21 Lunch with the Chief, sponsored by the Marco Island Police Foundation, was held at Hideaway Beach Club. Chief Schettino and approx. 25 Officers and Staff members attended.
- May 22 The Marco Island Police Foundation named Officer Brian Granneman Officer of the Year.
- May 23 MIPD Tweet From the Beat (virtual ride-along) resulted in 66 tweets and 26 new followers.

## Investigations

- **Investigations/Follow-Up Investigations:**

- Detectives conducted eighty-four (84) investigations for the month.

- **Significant Incidents/Investigations:**

- MIPD Officers responded to scene of a traffic crash. One person claimed to be a victim of battery. The case was sent to State Attorney's Office for review.
- MIPD Officers conducted a traffic stop. Further investigation revealed that the driver was 14 years old. A citation was issued and a notice to appear in court filed.
- MIPD Detectives are conducting an investigation regarding a vacation rental fraud. Residence was listed on Craigslist without the owner's knowledge or consent.
- MIPD Officers responded to a vehicle crash at Bald Eagle and Park Ave. Single vehicle struck a light pole. Operator of vehicle was placed under arrest for DUI and transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers responded to a North Barfield residence in reference to a subject making threats with several knives to persons inside the residence. Subject was also suicidal. Officers apprehended the subject with no use of force.
- MIPD Officers responded to Addison Court in reference to persons loitering. After further investigation, officers discovered one subject was in possession of marijuana. The subject was charged with possession of marijuana – less than 20 grams, and was given a notice to appear in court.
- MIPD Officers responded to a South Collier Blvd. business in reference to a fight. One subject was arrested and transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers investigated a runaway juvenile. Juvenile subject returned home the following day.
- MIPD Officers responded to North Collier on a single vehicle accident. Vehicle struck a tree. The driver was charged with DUI and transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers responded to a South Collier Blvd. residence in reference to a domestic dispute. One female subject was arrested and charged with domestic battery and transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers responded to a Marco Island motel in reference to a guest who rented a room for several days and left without paying. In addition, the room was damaged. Several hours later, MIPD Officers observed the suspect driving a vehicle. A traffic stop was initiated and the suspect was arrested and charged with defrauding an inn keeper. The suspect was transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers responded to a South Collier Blvd. parking lot in reference to a small dog that was left in a locked car. The dog was in distress due to the heat. Officers gained entry into the vehicle and attended to the dog. The owner of the dog was located and animal services issued a

citation. According to the dog owner, she had to be out of the rental house that morning and had no one to watch her dog.

- MIPD Officers initiated a traffic stop. The operator of the vehicle had a suspended license; further investigation revealed that the operator was in possession of marijuana. The subject was placed under arrest and transported to Naples Jail Center.
- MIPD Officers responded to a report of a disturbance at a store on Bald Eagle Drive. One subject was issued a notice to appear for battery.
- MIPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on S. Heathwood Drive. The subject was stopped for speeding. After speaking with the motorist and explaining why he was stopped, the subject became irate and drove away. The subject was stopped again and issued a citation for failure to obey officer's direction.
- MIPD Officers arrested one subject on an outstanding warrant from Collier County for battery. Further investigation conducted by officers revealed that the subject was in possession of marijuana. Subject was placed under arrest and transported to Naples Jail Center.

## Property & Evidence

Evidence Officer Ludwigsen attended training at the Miami FDLE office led by Dana Leitz, the Property and Evidence Manager for the Boca Raton Police Department. The 2-day course focused on the process of turning in evidence by Officers, and carried through to testing, storage, inventory accounting and disposal. The course also covered various Florida Statutes governing the evidence management area.

Operation Medicine Cabinet has collected 169.0 pounds of prescription and over-the-counter medication for 2015. These items will be incinerated at a later date.

The Property and Evidence section received 40 logged items in May and 40 in June, bringing the 2015 total intake to 285 logged items. Additionally, 12 items were returned to claimants. No items were disposed of by destruction during the May–June time frame.

The total inventory for the Property and Evidence section through June 30, 2015 is 3,750 logged items, with a total quantity of 11,406 items.

## Beach Patrol

Fifty-four (54) unique events included 30 Police or Community Service Officer initiated patrols on the beach or water immediately adjacent to the beach, 13 foot patrols, 4 code violations, and 2 vessel inspections/assists.

## Community Service Officers / Code Enforcement

The Department's eight part-time CSO's conducted community patrols of beach, parks, schools, commercial and residential areas. They assisted Law Enforcement personnel with several vehicle crash investigations, fingerprinting on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and issuance of RV parking permits.

In May, Community Service and Law Enforcement personnel attended to 225 CAD (Dispatched) events classified as “Code Complaints” at 200 unique addresses. CAD events at repeat addresses included follow-up investigations.

The Department received twenty-four (24) noise-related complaints in May, with only two occurring during regular CSO working hours. You will note that verified noise complaints, handled by MIPD Patrol Officers, are automatically followed-up with appropriate action by the Code Enforcement Unit. In May, the Code Enforcement Unit sent 16 Courtesy Notices to owners of locations with verified first-time noise violations.

Community Service Officers opened 86 cases in May, and closed 97. Community Service Officers often close cases opened in prior months once compliance has been obtained.

In May, Community Service Officers began Sea Turtle light inspections on the beach in the evenings.

During the Memorial Day weekend, Community Service Officers conducted an enforcement initiative on the beach – specific to prohibited glass containers. The first element of the initiative was education. The Department has been educating the public virtually nonstop for the past several months through personal contact and providing plastic cups when a violation is observed. Additionally, we have been and continue to use social media to communicate the “no glass on the beach message.” This weekend, we will use our electronic message trailer as well as several large A-frame signs to further communicate the message.
